WHAT DOES CHSF DO?

The CHSF supports the Leeds Congenital Heart Unit by providing the funding and resources needed to care for a patient's heart, mind, family and future. In the most recent reporting year, CHSF invested £643,363 in 68 different projects and initiatives. WHAT DOES CORAM DO?

Coram supports young people across the UK, including three key programmes: Life Education, Beanstalk and Shakespeare Schools Foundation. Coram's Life Education resources has supported 575,000 primary school children in Scotland and England. The Beanstalk reading programme supports 5,000 pupils in 2021/2022, with 90% showing improved engagement with reading. The Coram Shakespeare Schools Foundation worked with 9,173 pupils in 2021/2022, with a particular focus on working with ethnically diverse pupils and SEN schools.

Over the last three years we have supported Coram to develop a new Commercial Participator Agreement for their corporate partners, volunteered at the Coram Beanstalk Bookfest, taken part in raffles, quizzes, bake sales and a number of our colleagues have taken part in the London marathon, raising substantial funds.

SCOTLAND // THE ROCK TRUST

WHAT DOES THE ROCK TRUST DO?

The Rock Trust is a charity based in Scotland that focuses on helping young people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Their mission is to prevent youth homelessness and improve the lives of vulnerable young people. They do this through various programmes and services, including housing support, education and employment support, advice and information, peer support, advocacy and campaigning.

OUR PARTNERSHIP

Over the last three years we have partnered on the Future Builders programme - including providing support on lease agreements, and developed a Street Law project to provide information about housing law and rights. Fundraising activities have included open water swims, raffles, quizzes, football tournamants, Stay:Up, bake sales, the Edinburgh marathon and relay and the Kiltwalk.
